

### **BRIDGING OUR ENERGY GRANT**

NIPSCO, in partnership with the NiSource Charitable Foundation, was proud to launch the new Bridging Our Energy Grant, a bi-annual endowment supporting two northern Indiana non-profit organizations. This new \$200,000 grant will be divided into two annual installments of \$50,000 to help fund strategic initiatives focused on diversity, equity, inclusion (DEI) and economic inclusion programs.

The Bridging Our Energy Grant received 46 applications from organizations across NIPSCO's northern service area. Purdue University Northwest and Boys & Girls Club of Northern Indiana Corridor were awarded \$100,000 each. In recognition of their strong submissions the YWCA Northeast Indiana and Amani Fort Wayne were both awarded \$10,000.

#### **Purdue University Northwest**

Purdue University Northwest will use the funds to launch a diversity outreach and engagement program for its Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering. This program supports Dr. Arash Asrari's focus on power system resilience, smart grids and renewable energy.

The Boys & Girls Club of Northern Indiana Corridor will use the funds to debut an emotional well-being service program expansion to serve children in White, Pulaski, Fulton and Cass counties.

#### **CATALYST PROJECTS**

In 2024, NIPSCO and the NiSource Charitable Foundation provided funding to organizations focused on making positive contributions to the communities we are privileged to serve.

### \$50,000 TO FORTIFY LIFE

In support of Fortify Life's rural disparity project, a Northeast Indiana poverty initiative to educate, instill empathy and engage leaders in collaborative discussions around the unique needs of rural communities like DeKalb County.

#### \$50,000 TO JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF CHICAGO

The Junior Achievement of Chicago (JAC) Metaversity enables K-6 students to explore careers in a virtual space. The customized platform introduces utility careers for our future workforce.

#### \$37,000 FAMILY ADVOCATES

Funding supports the build-out of a youth-centered space for social and emotional learning, support groups and strength-based programming which will provide academic support, leadership, and personal and vocational development for several hundred youth and families in La Porte County.

#### \$30,000 TO FAMILY SERVICE ASSOCIATION INC.

With support for a renovated kitchen, dining and living spaces at Domestic Violence Shelter in Kokomo. A client expressed gratitude, noting the New World charm and coordinated style of the remodeled spaces, reflecting the positive impact on residents' daily lives.

#### \$25,000 TO INDIANA UNIVERSITY KOKOMO

Funding the incoming students' summer experience, the KEY Summer Institute is a three-day experience on campus to help new students adjust to college and develop professional skills for gaining on-campus employment. Students benefit from this relationship-building experience toward a goal of success on campus.

#### \$25,000 TO YOUTH SERVICE BUREAU OF ST. JOSEPH COUNTY

With a goal of youth access to safety, shelter and the opportunity to succeed, YSB helps youth repair foundations damaged by abuse, neglect, homelessness and lack of resources by teaching them how to overcome the complex barriers to self-sufficiency. Funding helped purchase furniture and goods to make the shelter feel like home.

# **PUBLIC SAFETY GRANT**

\$66,000 TO EDUCATION AND TRAINING IN 2024

These projects were geared toward community and youth public safety education as well as training for first responders, police and fire departments. #### **IMPACTFUL GRANTS**

Through impactful grants, NIPSCO, together with the NiSource Charitable Foundation, provides multi-year funding for innovative programs that are experimental in nature. This partnership allows organizations to have the bandwidth to create, test and measure the success of their program or project, building a business case toward sustainable funding.

#### **SAVE THE DUNES**

With funding for environmental restoration and awareness, Save the Dunes creates collaborative partnerships across the Northwest Indiana lakeshore to protect and defend the Indiana dunes from a variety of threats. They work to enhance and protect the incredible biodiversity of our natural spaces through advocacy, conservation and community engagement.

#### CROWN POINT COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Funding for the Nonprofit Academy, providing essential skills, knowledge and resources to enhance staff and mission impact through training facilitated by Indiana University Fundraising School at the Lilly Family School of Philanthropy.

#### KOKOMO YMCA: STEM CAMP

STEM education is delivered through summer camp at Camp Tycony in Howard County. Balloon-powered cars, egg drops, hurricane houses and cardboard boat races engage campers while teaching scientific methods and encouraging discovery of how things work. This is the second year with this impactful partnership.

#### **COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS GRANT**

In partnership with Arts United, the Community Connections grant supports vibrant neighborhoods through community engagement experiences in Southeast Fort Wayne, a target quadrant for economic development and business investment.

# **ENVIRONMENTAL ACTION GRANT**

\$78,700 FOR ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP IN 2024

Since 2016, NIPSCO's Environmental Grant has donated \$577,700, helping 143 projects come to fruition across northern Indiana. Last year's projects focused on native habitat restoration, wildlife research, youth nature programming, pollinator projects, water quality monitoring, rainscaping education and woods worker safety training. Many of the 21 funded projects and programs in 2024 included a significant volunteer and community engagement component, encouraging community members to give back through environmental stewardship projects.
